**THE FIRST READING STATES** "God's ways are not our ways; God's thoughts are not our thoughts."

Just how vast is the difference between God's ways and our ways, God's thoughts and our thoughts? This is illustrated in the Gospel. God's generosity utterly transcends human generosity.

In the parable Jesus faces up to His critics and shows them what God is like. God is generous and full of compassion for the poor and the outcast. God deals with us in ways that are very different from the ways we normally deal with other people or with one another. As high as the heavens are above the earth, so high is God's generosity above our generosity. The goodness of God is a great comfort to us but it is also a great challenge because we are called to imitate it; to make our ways of dealing with one another more like God's way of dealing with us.

It is with the heart that we grasp God's ways. Once God has touched our hearts and warmed them with His love, we will begin to love in our turn and then we will truly know what God is like. God is love.

*"Lord, open our minds and enlarge our hearts so that we think more like You and act like You. Let us never begrudge Your goodness to others, knowing that we are undeserving of Your favours and stand more in need of Your mercy and forgiveness."*
